Unfortunately, most of its points are misleading or irrelevant.

## Some points:

- -- The Iranians fired the missiles from Iranian territory.
- --The Hufhi claim of responsibility is a transparent effort to confuse the issue. The Huthis likely coordinated this messaging in advance with their Iranian masters.
- --The Iranian attacks on Saudi oil should be seen in the context of a long-term plan of aggression stretching from Lebabon and Yemen to Afghanistan. Many details of their aggression are not publicly known.
- --The recent escalations (tanker attacks, the Abqaiq missile attack) test how far iran can go without serious US retaliation. Answer: quite far, since they have taken 50 percent of Saudi output offline.
- -- The US has economic sanctions to use, but these are of declining effectiveness, since China and others are ignoring them.
- --US military options are limited, since they would likely have to escalate quickly to all-out war, the consequences of which are unknowable. Many or most Sunni Arab states are highly unstable, and the risk of regional chaos is high.
- --Precision missiles now based in Iran and Lebanon could destroy a wide range of critical infrastructure in Israel, Saudi Arabia and the GCC states.
- --Iran has a full range of limited and not so limited military options. In gametheoretical terms, it has escalation dominance.
- --If this is Iran's strategic position without nuclear weapons, imagine what it will do with nuclear weapons. Anyone who believes their nuclear program is peaceful is worse than naive.
